

The promise of a better life for the millions of economically disadvantaged Filipino students finds realization in the low-cost but quality education offered by the Polytechnic University of the Philippines, providing this multitudinous student population, the biggest in the country, with myriad opportunities and avenues in a quest for a greener pasture. No doubt that the University has been doing many good things to those who are economically challenged.

PUP President's Report 2009 displays with pride the laurels it reaped in the year under review. These feats embody the University's pure and brimming dedication to the future while projecting a very fine image of strength and greatness that even time will not eradicate.

LINKAGES WITH GOVERNMENT, NONGOVERNMENT, AND INTERNATIONAL AGENCIES

- PUP forged agreements with the Department of Energy (DOE) and the Philippine Broadcasting System (PBS)
 - PUP, in partnership with DOE, would pursue various projects related to the development of natural gas industry and the establishment of Natural Gas Institute.
 - PUP and PBS have agreed to continue coproducing two weekly international radio programs being aired over Radyo Pilipinas: training and empowerment of Overseas Filipino Workers (OFWs) throughout the world, and Radioversity, a distance education on-the-air project initiated by the PUP Open University and PBS in collaboration with the Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP).
- Under the agreement signed with Mayor Jesse Concepcion of Mariveles, Bataan, the PUP-Bataan Campus would offer Bachelor in Elementary Education. The local government agreed to shoulder the salary of faculty members in the said academic program.
- The MOA signed with Sang Yong Kim, General Manager of the Korean Company East Cam Tech, stipulates the accommodation of PUP Bataan Campus students for the on-the-job training in the said company and the eventual absorption of these student-trainees as employees of the company.
- Majority of the colleges have existing MOAs with international and local industries, government, and nongovernment agencies.







OFFICE OF THE PRESIDENT

Year 2009 saw the Guevarra administration come to full circle in full gear. In an effort to achieve the overall aspiration of a Total University and create a sustainable culture of continuous improvement and service excellence to support the University's mission, the offices under the OP proudly wear the golden feathers in their caps reaped in the year under review.



With its major function to fuel its people's drive to set their eyes on the University's long-range plans, the OP bears out the desire to accomplish things with efficiency and efficacy. Among its major feats in 2009 included the following:

Office of the University Board Secretary

Behind the success of the Board of Regents' regular meetings is the extensive and efficient effort exerted by the Office of the University Board Secretary (UBS). Four regular meetings and one special board meeting of the Board of Regents (BOR), the highest governing body of the University, were competently facilitated by the unit. The office was responsible for the comprehensive detailing, preparation, and distribution of papers or documents to each member of the BOR days prior to the schedule of meetings, thus, resulting in a more focused and fruitful discussion of matters pertaining to essential University concerns. Moreover, the UBS helped facilitate the Zero Waste Management Project at the oval dumpsite and the Bingo Socials held during the University Christmas celebration.

Legal Office

The Legal Office is committed to provide quality legal services for the University. Year 2009 made the office relatively busy. By advising the administration, faculty, employees, and students on legal matters pertaining to the University, legal risks and liabilities in the institution were minimized. It conducted and attended hearings of cases arising from purported violations of laws and office rules and regulations by officials and personnel of the University.

For the year 2009, the Legal Office approved 40 faculty/employee clearances and 6, 312 student clearances, issued 1, 292 affidavits of loss, reviewed 57 memoranda of agreement, and resolved 30 cases.

Public Affairs Office

From its humble beginnings, the Polytechnic University of the Philippines has played a vital role in public life. In 2009, the ever-dependable Public Affairs Office (PAO) was no doubt at its busiest in projecting the positive image of both the University and the state through print and broadcast media (both radio and television), and its linkages with private and government organizations and media practitioners.

The Public Affairs Office under the close supervision of the Office of the President serves as a link to facilitate coordination and cooperation between the University and the public. It likewise promotes greater understanding and better relationship among the members of the academic community and between the University and other sectors of society; it develops and executes information and public relations programs and activities for the University to keep its public informed of the significant undertakings in the institution. Internal Audit Office

The Internal Audit Office (IAO) monitors the utilization of University resources by seeing to it that all disbursements are in conformity with existing accounting and auditing laws, rules, and regulations and that an effective system of internal control is implemented. Financial and compliance audits form a part of its job to regularly or periodically check and monitor the accuracy of financial statements or records in the institution.

Among the tasks accomplished by the IAO during the year included:

- audit of the income statement of the University Canteen;
- examination of the balance sheet, income statement, and any other related records on loan releases and loan balances;
- monitoring of funds of the various accredited student organizations on the main campus and the satellite campuses;
- visiting the satellite campuses to:
 - monitor the collection of tuition and other fees;
 - conduct cash examinations and compliance checking in conformance with the Commission on Audit (COA) rules and regulations and accounting and auditing control measures; and
 - recommend the use of appropriate liquidation measures;
- verifying and reporting rental payments, commissions from the selling of uniforms, income from canteen concessionaires and photo and X-ray services, and all other income-generating projects of the University; and
- conduct of other activities:
 - monthly inspection of delivered janitorial supplies and materials;
 - monitoring and checking of the collection of tuition and any other fees received by the University Cashier's Office;
 - review of the summary of collection from connection to the Server Office and collection activities from the SIS enrollment system;
 - monitoring the deposit to ascertain the timely remittance of collection and ensure the accuracy of recording and reporting of collection;
 - preinspection and postinspection of various repairs and construction projects within the University;
 - inspection of unserviceable University properties and monitoring of their proper disposal; and
 - examination and evaluation of income-generating activities of the University.

Security Office

The Security Office has implemented University policies relative to security-force operation. The unit enforced security measures for personnel, students, installation, classified documents and materials, and any other University property against threat, sabotage, fire, theft, and any other damages. It also ensured peace and order on the satellite campuses of the University. The office, likewise, exhibited its flexibility in handling special University events that needed security measures for high-ranking personalities in the country like Hon. Noli De Castro, Sen. Ramon "Bong" Revilla, PAGCOR Chairman Efraim C. Genuino, and Gov. Rafael Nantes of Quezon.

Community Relations Office

The Community Relations Office (CRO) is responsible for the development and implementation of specific community projects with the members of the academic community, government, and nongovernment institutions. It operates as an integral link in the establishment of rapport between the University and its immediate neighbors. Along this line, the office, through the Day Care Center, continues to provide education to preschool and street children.

For the year 2009, the CRO coordinated the clearing of the streets being used as access to PUP and monitored the safety and accessibility of these streets. It also voluntarily offered services, such as medical assistance and cleanliness drive to the community and assisted other agencies and the neighboring barangays by allowing them to utilize the facilities of the University. - Participation in the Children's Hour fund-raising project sponsored by the College of Business.

Special Projects Office

The Special Projects Office (SPO) people, who never wasted time, worked their fingers to the bone to accomplish the following projects:

NDC Campus Project Management Office

The NDC Campus Project Management Office almost burned the candle at both ends to carry out the following tasks:

- Properly documented and negotiated the relocation of 549 families that have been informally settling in front of the NDC Campus on Road 12 and Anonas Street Extension through the help of the Local Inter-Agency Committee (LIAC), City of Government of Manila Presidential Commission on Urban Poor, Commission on Human Rights, HUDDC, NHA, DSWD, DepEd, DPWH, and MMDA;
- Signed a MOA with Mr. Mariano Nocum, President of Ceramics Corp., to provide the entrance fee for 549 informal settlers of Road 12 as prequalified by the NHA; payment of equity was done to develop the said area and to follow up the documents with the Community Mortgage Plan (CMP) and Socialized Housing Corporation;
- Got LIAC's approval to develop plans for the informal settlers before the relocation;
- Identified Barangay Tigbe, Norzagaray, Bulacan as the relocation site for the informal settlers through the assistance of CHED Foundation, Inc. and LIAC;
- Facilitated the relocation of informal settlers in coordination with local government officials headed by Congressman Benny M. Abante;
- Established linkages with Bahay Kalinga, LIAC, and Fr. Nonong of Caritas to seek support for the relocation and livelihood of the informal settlers in Calauan, Laguna; and
- Assisted in the proposal to establish the PUP Calauan Campus by coordinating with the PUP Board of Regents, Sangguniang Bayan of Calauan, Office of the Calauan Mayor and other local units, and CHED.



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OFFICE OF THE VICE PRESIDENT FOR ACADEMIC AFFAIRS



The tireless efforts of the academic sector under the Office of the Vice President for Academic Affairs (OVPAA) headed by Dr. Samuel M. Salvador have paid off strikingly with the giant strides it made in both national and international scenes. In directing the program standards of the University to keep up with globalization and ensure the labor-market responsiveness of the academic programs, the members of the different units under the OVPAA practically worked at all hours and went the extra mile not only for the accreditation of their programs by the AACCU^P but also for the exemplary performance of their graduates at the licensure examinations and the improvement of facilities needed by the students.

Further, to continuously promote a strong faculty and quality instruction that resemble solidified institutional capabilities, the OVPAA encourages faculty members to pursue graduate and postgraduate studies, and attend seminars, trainings, development programs, and any other relevant curricular undertakings to be better equipped in their interactions with their

ever-insightful and inquisitive students. In like manner, the latter, inspired by their mentors, participate in different trainings and various local, national, and international conferences and competitions. More often than not, these students, cliché as a cliché, bring home the bacon. On top of that, scholarships are awarded to carefully chosen and monitored faculty members and students deserving of the benefits.

For better access and equity, the avowed mission of the University to serve the community is being realized through the services it has extended to the immediate communities. The use of ICT resources has been made available to all community members; thus, it has greatly contributed to the ease and speed of the collection and dissemination of information in higher education, instruction, research, extension, and the strengthening of linkages between local and international agencies.

The OVPAA continuously attends to the academic problems and concerns of both students and faculty members. The VPAA himself acts on students' requests that are duly noted by the chair of the department and recommended for approval by the dean.

From January to April and August to November, the periods coinciding with the release of the evaluation results of the students' application for graduation, the VPAA assisted the candidates by doing the following:

- Expediting the submission of grade sheets to complete the evaluation of student records and recommend the candidates for graduation;
 - Allowing the students with subjects that have not been credited to enroll in the next term to finish all academic requirements at the soonest and graduate at the immediately following commencement exercises;
 - Acting as Chair of the Honors Committee that is tasked to evaluate applications for graduation with honors; and
 - Acting as Chair of the Graduation Committee that is tasked to ensure the successful conduct of the graduation rites.

 - Member of the CHED Technical Working Committee on Transnational Education.

The applicants are then interviewed by the VPAA, who recommends them to the President.





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OFFICE OF THE VICE PRESIDENT FOR STUDENT SERVICES



PUP's primary clientele is its students whose needs and concerns must be served to the fullest possible measure. The Office of the Vice President for Student Services (OVPSS) under the headship of Dr. Juan C. Birion is the hub of this essential function. It supports the academic sector in guaranteeing that the underprivileged students of the University secure themselves with the passport — education — to the “greener pasture” they quest for. Further, it assists the students to ensure that they do not get off tangent in their search for a better life. The multifarious services offered by the OVPSS to achieve these ends include easy enrollment procedures, better guidance services and placement assistance, more scholarship grants and leadership trainings, and improved library and learning facilities. All these services and more, given to the biggest student population in the entire archipelago, are adequately performed by the OVPSS.

The OVPSS supervises the different offices directly under it and coordinates with the different service offices or units of the University. The offices directly under the OVPSS include the following: Office of the University Registrar (OUR); Admission Office (AO); Guidance, Counseling, and Testing Center (GCTC); Office of Student Services (OSS); Career Development and Placement Office (CDPO); Ninoy Aquino Library and Learning Resources Center (NALLRC); and the University Center for Culture and the Arts (UCCA). Some auxiliary services are directly supervised by the Office of the President or the Office of the Vice President for Administration. With quality always as its top priority, the OVPSS counts the following accomplishments in 2009:

- Supervised as Overall Chair of the PUPCET 2009 Committee the administration of the PUP College Entrance Examinations to 27, 498 fourth year high school students applying for admission to the main campus and 12,665 to the satellite campuses;
- Administered the PUP Laboratory High School Entrance Test;
- Led the OVPSS directors and chiefs in revisiting guidelines and policies that were subsequently incorporated in the PUP Student Manual 2009;
- Represented the University in extending its expertise and technological packages through the VPSS serving as resource speaker and lecturer;
- Continued to forge linkages with different external agencies, offices, and organizations to strengthen and improve student services, such as scholarships, culture and the arts, placement and career development, and library services; and
- Represented the University President in external functions and meetings through the VPSS.

The Assistant to the VPSS was part of the PUP delegation that was sent to Beijing, China to promote and market the University among universities in the cities of Changchun and Tianjin, resulting in the signing of a Memorandum of Agreement between Dr. Dante G. Guevarra, PUP President and Zhou Wei, CEO of Beijing Hangweili Educational Technology Ltd.

Office of the University Registrar

The OUR's accomplishment report focuses on activities that include the following:

- Evaluated a total of 7,754 student records and received a total of 7,679 requests for credentials and 6,120 application forms for graduation for SY 2009-2010;
- Recommended to the University Academic Council the approval of applications for graduation of 6,609 and 1,018 candidates for the 2009 yearend and midyear commencement exercises, respectively;
- Scanned a total of 10,630 documents as part of the e-Docs projects;
- Signed 54,334 requested credentials, 10,932 of which were endorsed to the Department of Foreign Affairs for authentication;
- Printed 4,865 diplomas and 5,954 grade sheets; and
- Processed applications for PUPCET 2009-2010.

Admission Office

For the year under review, the AO undertook the following:

- Intensified the standardization and computerization of recruitment, admission, and registration of prospective students from all secondary schools within and outside the National Capital Region;
- Continued to collaborate with the ICTC, OUR, finance, and academic sectors of the University for the implementation of i-Apply and Student Information System (SIS);
- Reviewed the University policies and guidelines on recruitment and admission, registration, and enrollment;
- Issued 27,593 permits to PUPCET applicants;
- Cosupervised the administration of the 2010 PUPCET 1st batch with 15,474 actual examinees;
- Coordinated with the core offices for the smooth flow of 2nd semester enrollment.
- Issued duplicate copies of registration certificates of students who lost their original copies;
- Assisted and advised 54 students who applied for readmission and those with on-probationary status;
- Requested Form 137A of 7,120 freshmen and other officially admitted students from secondary schools where they graduated;
- Documented the Student Admission Records File (SARF) of all officially admitted freshman students and transferees for SY 2009-2010;

- Standardized the registration certificate forms for all campuses;
- Disseminated information about PUPCET to 1,025 high schools through mails and personal visits;
- Processed admission credentials of 313 transferees;
- Coordinated with the directors and heads of admission and registration offices of satellite campuses for the scheduling and processing of PUPCET 2010 for SY 2010-2011; and
- Worked with the ICTC staff to implement the PUPCET computerized system and Student Information System (SIS) on the satellite campuses.

Office of the Student Services

The OSS — the seat of talents and leaders — is assigned the formidable task of providing assistance to the different student organizations in the University. Nevertheless, the cooperative attitude of the student groups ensured the success of the OSS whose major feats for 2009 were listed, thus:


- Monitored the operations and activities of the Office and continued to uphold the dynamism of the central and college student councils, academic and nonacademic student organizations, student campus publications, and any other student groups, such as fraternities and sororities;
- Approved the validation and revalidation of student organizations in the University through the Commission on Student Organization Accreditation (COSOA);
- Endorsed students who joined local and international competitions, namely, European Union Whiz '09 – The National Championship held at the SM Mall of Asia and sponsored by the European Commission and 3Vents Sylphide Corporation where PUP was awarded 1st runner-up, and the Search for Ten Outstanding Students of the Philippines;
- Endorsed the participation of PUP student leaders in prestigious invitational conferences: CHED Student Congress, 10th International Youth Day Celebration and Youth and Educators' Summit for the Millennium Development Goals, College Y Club Management Training, Career Congress for Student Leaders, 1st National Student Safety and Security Conference, Democracy Camp Philippines, 13th Civitas Asia National Students Conference, 30th ACSA Annual National Convention and Seminar Workshop, 47th National Rizal Youth Leadership Institute Conference, Commission on Filipino Overseas Advocacy Training for Youth on Anti-Trafficking of Women and Children for Labor and Sexual Exploitation, 2nd Future Leaders of Asia Forum, Youth Humanitarian Forum, Youth Hours 2009, and 34th YMCA National Congress of College Students;
- Established linkage with the Advocates for Environment and Social Justice for the removal of the Pandacan Oil Depot;
- Processed the application of 647 academic and nonacademic scholars on the main campus; and
- Facilitated the application of 194 scholars on the campuses of PUP in Bataan, Bansud, Lopez, Mulanay, Sta. Rosa, and Taguig.

Office for Scholarship and Financial Assistance

The OSFA is always on the lookout for scholarship funds and donors who understand the needs of the University's economically disadvantaged students seeking scholarships. For 2009, the office facilitated the signing of MOAs between PUP and donors here and abroad.

The OSFA processed and approved a number of applications for scholarships on the main campus and the satellite campuses. The Office also reviewed the scholarship policies and guidelines included in the Manual of Scholarship and Financial Assistance. Moreover, it monitored and evaluated the applications of students graduating with honors.

Guidance, Counseling, and Testing Center

Primarily concerned with the task of assisting several hundreds of students who seek guidance, the GCTC personnel has its hands on deck to deliver services intended to develop the students' potentials. There are no dull moments at the office since all its programs are geared toward developing and professionalizing people. In 2009, the GCTC undertook the following:

- Counseled students with problems and conducted case conferences with parents or guardians concerning students' academic, vocational, and personal problems;
- Supervised the administration of the PUP Laboratory High School Entrance Examination;
- Assisted in the administration of PUPCET to applicants on the main campus and the satellite campuses;
- Administered the PUP Scholastic, Academic, and Interest Test (PUPSAIT) to 640 academic entrance scholars, athletes, journalists, artists, presidents of high school student councils, and awardees;
- Administered, checked, and interpreted psychological tests of applicants for University entrance scholarships, faculty and administrative employee positions, student assistantship, dorm accommodation, practicum, and Open University System admission; and
- Conducted seminars on values development and self-awareness as well as career orientation for high school students and preemployment seminars for graduating students.

University Center for Culture and the Arts

The University, through the UCCA, recognizes the immense value of tapping and harnessing the artistic talents of students in the fields of dance, stage plays, literature, and any other art forms. As the University's cultural arm tasked to keep culture and the arts alive, the UCCA achieved these feats, thus, projecting a fine image for the University.

- The Maharlika Dance Artists performed at the International Convention of Edmark held at the PICC Plenary Hall. Career Development and Placement Office

In essence, the success of curricular offerings and/or academic programs offered by a university is sometimes judged by the number of its graduates who are absorbed by the industry and any other agencies needing manpower to fill their labor and supervisory requirements.

The CDPO has succeeded in establishing linkages outside PUP, particularly with public and private firms, where PUP graduates have enjoyed a competitive edge given the quality of their preparation. It is very interesting to note the positive feedback gathered from concerned companies whose honest-to-goodness evaluation of PUP graduates, trainees, and practicumers served as pointers to academic curriculum planners.

The Office, in its continuing quest to provide career opportunities to PUP students and alumni, has organized job fairs, preemployment seminars, mock recruitments, and career talks to enhance the marketability of PUP graduates as they strive to find their niches in the business world.

The 2009 Careers Here and Abroad, a job fair organized by the CDPO in partnership with PUP ICTC and powered by Jobs.DB.com, has issued more than 1,000 career cards to students and alumni who participated in the event. The said

occasion was graced by the Deputy Director General of TESDA, Hon. Roger C. Peyuan. Held in February and September, respectively, a total of 152 companies participated to provide varied job opportunities to more than 4,000 job-seeking PUP students and alumni, with the assistance of different government agencies, such as Civil Service Commission, PhilHealth, Social Security System, National Statistics Office, National Bureau of Investigation, Philippine Overseas and Employment Administration, Department of Labor and Employment, and TESDA.

Center for Data and Statistical Analysis

In support of the University's vision of uplifting and further developing both the students' and the faculty's academic performance, the Center for Data and Statistical Analysis (CDSA) has been created to respond to the need for a responsible data processing and analysis of faculty or institutional researches, undergraduate or graduate theses, and researches of non-PUP clients.

The unit posts the following accomplishments for the year 2009:

- Analysis of data gathered from the surveys conducted: Acceptability of Student Information System (SIS) to Freshman Students of School Year 2008-2009, Course and School Preferences of Selected Third Year and Fourth Year Students in NCR (an input for the feasibility study on setting up the College of Nursing in PUP), Board and Lodging Business in the Area Close to the Site of the Proposed PUP Dormitory, and Demand for Three Health Sciences Programs in PUP (the survey was conducted as part of the online PUPCET registration system called i-Apply);

- Statistical consultancy rendered to both undergraduate and graduate school students (five GS students and some AB English students under the College of Languages and Linguistics);
- Prof. Norie M. Lolong, chief of the CDSA Training Section, attended the SPSS Conference 2009 on October 22 at the Sofitel, Roxas Boulevard, Pasay City and the Training on Econometric Modeling held at the Statistical Research Training Center, Kalayaan Avenue, Quezon City on October 5 to 9.


**Center for Human Development/

Luna attended a two-day national conference on education at the Heritage Hotel, Roxas Boulevard, Pasay City on November 26 and 27 with the theme “Excellence in Education: Leading Minds and Creating the Future in a Global Journey,” organized by the Philippine Educators Network for Training, Research, and Development, Inc. (PENTRAD) in cooperation with the Department of Education and the Commission on Higher Education.
- On May 15, the CPPS jointly sponsored and organized with the PUP Research Institute for Politics and Economics (RIPE) the symposium “The Cuban and Venezuelan 21st Century Socialism Models: Prospects for the Philippine Conscientious Left” where noted thinkers of the Philippine Left and reputable foreign visitors lectured and participated in the discussion. Moreover, the CHD and the CPPS provided technical assistance in the conduct of the environmental forum held at the PUP Sto. Tomas Campus on July 30 with the theme “Your Planet Needs You – Unite to Combat Climate Change.”
- In January 2009, Dr. de Guzman got his second-term appointment as member of the CHED Technical Working Committee for Sociology. In May, he was elected President of the Philippine Association for the Sociology of Religion. At present, he also serves as Board Member of the Philippine Sociological Society.
- Ms. Susan C. Luna, a staff member of the two centers, was elected Treasurer of the Philippine Educators Network for Training, Research, and Development.
- The CHD and the CPPS published *Education Review* Volume 1, Issue No. 2 in June and *The Mabini Review* Volume 1, Issue No. 2 in October which were both submitted to the Commission on Higher Education (CHED) for accreditation.
- Dr. de Guzman coedited a seminal book entitled *South Asia Today: Development Paradigms, Reflective Engagements* that was published in April 2009 by the Ateneo de Manila University through the Institute of Philippine Culture.
- The units assisted the College of Arts in the publication of the CA Research Journal 2006-2007 and 2007-2008 issues.

- Three researches of Dr. De Guzman were nominated by the PUP Research Management Office to qualify for the CHED Republica Awards: his Ph.D. dissertation "Blurring and Effacing the Other: Closures and Violence in the Disclosures of Radical Liberation Movements in the Philippines"; and two essays drawn from the said dissertation, "The Being of Ideology: Thoughts on the Discursive Constitution of the Individual and Collective Subject" and "The Sacred of Religion and the Sublime of Ideology: Constructing Collective Identity Through Religious Solidarities."

Center for Labor and Industrial Relations

Established in 2009, the new Center for Labor and Industrial Relations (CLIR) is dedicated to the scholarly investigation and dissemination of knowledge concerning human resources and industrial relations encompassing all facets of the employment relationship. The center, which serves as the unique bridge between the University and the labor community, was responsible for the accomplishment of the following projects:

OFFICE OF THE VICE PRESIDENT FOR FINANCE



The Office of the Vice President for Finance (OVPF) serves the University community by focusing on its major functions of generating funds and income to finance the operations of the University, holding the purse strings to prudently budget such funds, procuring quality supplies and materials, optimizing idle funds to bring in additional income, and accounting for the use of such funds. Under the close supervision and able leadership of Ms. Marissa J. Legaspi, the OVPF ensures that the University's financial operations are administered with efficiency, sound management, and transparency.

The following were the outstanding accomplishments of the OVPF in 2009:

- Coordinated the operations of the Budget Services, Accounting Department, Fund Management Office, Procurement Office, and Business Regulations Office;
- Implemented circulars, memoranda, and any other issuances having financial implications for the University;
- Represented the University President at a visit to seven (7) universities and two (2) middle schools in Beijing, Changchun and Jilin, Tianjin in China to encourage the exchange, collaboration, and mutual development of programs for both students and faculty members through the Changchun Jiayi Information Corporation on September 20-28;



- Participated in the final phase of the PUP Management Workshop, “Revisiting Policies and Guidelines for Institutional Efficiency and Effectiveness,” at EDSA Shangri-La, Ortigas, Pasig City on December 2;
- Facilitated the payment of retirement gratuity and terminal benefits of employees under the compulsory and optional retirement plans per Special Allotment Release Orders (SARO) issued by the Department of Budget and Management (DBM);

Human Resource Management Division

The office of the Human Resource Management Division (HRMD) executes personnel policies of the University and those of the Civil Service Commission. In 2009, the HRMD provided the personnel requirements of the University by:

- handling and supervising the operations pertaining to recruitment, selection, appointment, placement, promotion, and retirement of academic and administrative personnel;

- taking charge of employees' compensation, plantilla preparation, performance evaluation, loyalty awards, notice of salary adjustments, and benefits;
- recommending policies relative to personnel administration;
- keeping and updating personnel records and reports, such as service record, PEF, clearance, and CEC, and the like;
- performing routine functions, such as
 - preparation of special orders, certifications, appointment papers, record cards, and the like;
 - taking charge of leave monitoring; and
 - checking of faculty attendance;

- maintaining liaison with the GSIS, Civil Service Commission, Department of Budget and Management, the Ombudsman, and the Senate; and
- attending trainings, seminars, conferences, and workshops as part of its staff development program.

Medical and Dental Services Office

The Office of the Medical and Dental Services assumes the responsibility of creating a highly productive PUP community that values the importance of optimum well-being achieved through a healthy behavior. The office ensures the health of the students, faculty, and staff by:

- delivering professional medical and dental services through preventive measures like annual physical examinations, treatments, and consultations;
- providing referrals and surgical interventions;
- promoting health education through the dissemination of vital information on maintenance of good health of target beneficiaries on the main campus and satellite campuses through posters, bulletin updates, exhibits, pamphlets, and any other reading materials;
- guaranteeing a clean and healthy environment through water analysis, routine sanitary inspection of the canteen and food stalls, and fumigation of all campuses;
- extending medical assistance to the satellite campuses through health screenings and services like FBS/cholesterol, ECG examinations, blood letting, foot Doppler examinations, and eye refraction;
- proffering extension service by accepting speaking engagements, serving as board reviewers and lecturers, and conducting medical mission like the "Operation Tule" and "Alis Bukol";
- attending seminars, trainings, and conferences as part of the continuing professional development of the office staff; and
- improving its medical and dental facilities via the acquisition of new equipment and furniture.



Central Records Office

The workers of the Central Records Office, who painstakingly oversee the systematic and efficient receipt, release, and filing of necessary official documents and communications, accomplished the following vital tasks:

- easy and fast retrieval of documents;
- management of records and files;
- organization of mails received;
- maintenance of active and inactive files; and
- professional development of staff.



Building and Grounds Maintenance Office

The unit attends to the proper care, preservation, and upkeep of furniture, buildings, and grounds of the University including electrical and plumbing services and sewer installation. The office is proud of its well-done jobs in 2009.

- Improved the quality and quantity maintenance of the Mabini campus as well as the satellite campuses
- Supervised ongoing constructions for conformity with approved plans and specifications
- Assisted in the various tasks related to the University's graduation programs

Motor Pool Unit

Providing safe transport services to University officials, faculty members, administrative employees, and students is the main function of the Motor Pool Unit. The office accomplished the following:

University Canteen

The unit implements policies of the University relative to canteen operations. Through the hard work and dedication of the members of the unit, the University canteen has improved the quality of food service by guaranteeing that nutritious foods served are affordable. Moreover, it provides catering services to the different offices or units of the campus and to the various University functions, such as Board, EXECOM, Academic Council, Administrative Council meetings. Imbued with the sense of civic engagement and volunteerism, the unit has offered an extension service by conducting the "Sagip Musmos" feeding program to deserving recipients of nearby barangays. On top of that, it has also overseen the upkeep of existing canteen facilities and acquired the latest equipment necessary for quality catering and food services.

Property and Supplies Office
